
Procedure for applying for necessary Co-op Work Permit from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) (Co-op programs – Applying for a Co-op Work Permit)

Studying in Canada can be a rewarding experience. A <u>Co-op or internship program</u> that is part of certain study programs can enhance this experience. Please note that Co-op Work Permit and Post-Graduation Work Permit are two completely different permits. Before presenting an application for a work permit for a co-op or internship program, verify if you meet the basic program requirements by consulting our website: <u>Work as a co-op student or</u> <u>intern - Determine your eligibility</u>. *Please note the co-op work permit is free to exempt*.

- Adobe Acrobat Reader : To download and open a PDF form, you need to have Adobe Reader 10 or higher installed. Mobile devices such as iPads, tablets and mobile phones can't be used for IRCC forms.
- Biometrics : Please see the current policy one the Government of Canada's official website.

* Before you submit your application, the following are required documents that you must prepare:

1. Co-op Letter (required); IRCC letter

You must provide a letter from your school indicating that work is a component of the academic program that all participants are expected to complete to receive their degree, diploma or certificate.

This letter must include:

- o details of the work to be performed
- the specific number of hours per term or semester

2. Passport (required)

You must submit a legible copy of your valid <u>travel document</u> which you will use to travel.

If you have a passport, you must provide a copy of:

- the page that shows your birth date and country of origin, and
- any pages with stamps, visas or markings.

If you do not have a passport and must use another travel document, it must be issued by a government and include your:

- o name,
- o date of birth,
- o document number,
- o citizenship or residency status,
- o photo, and

expiry date (if applicable).
